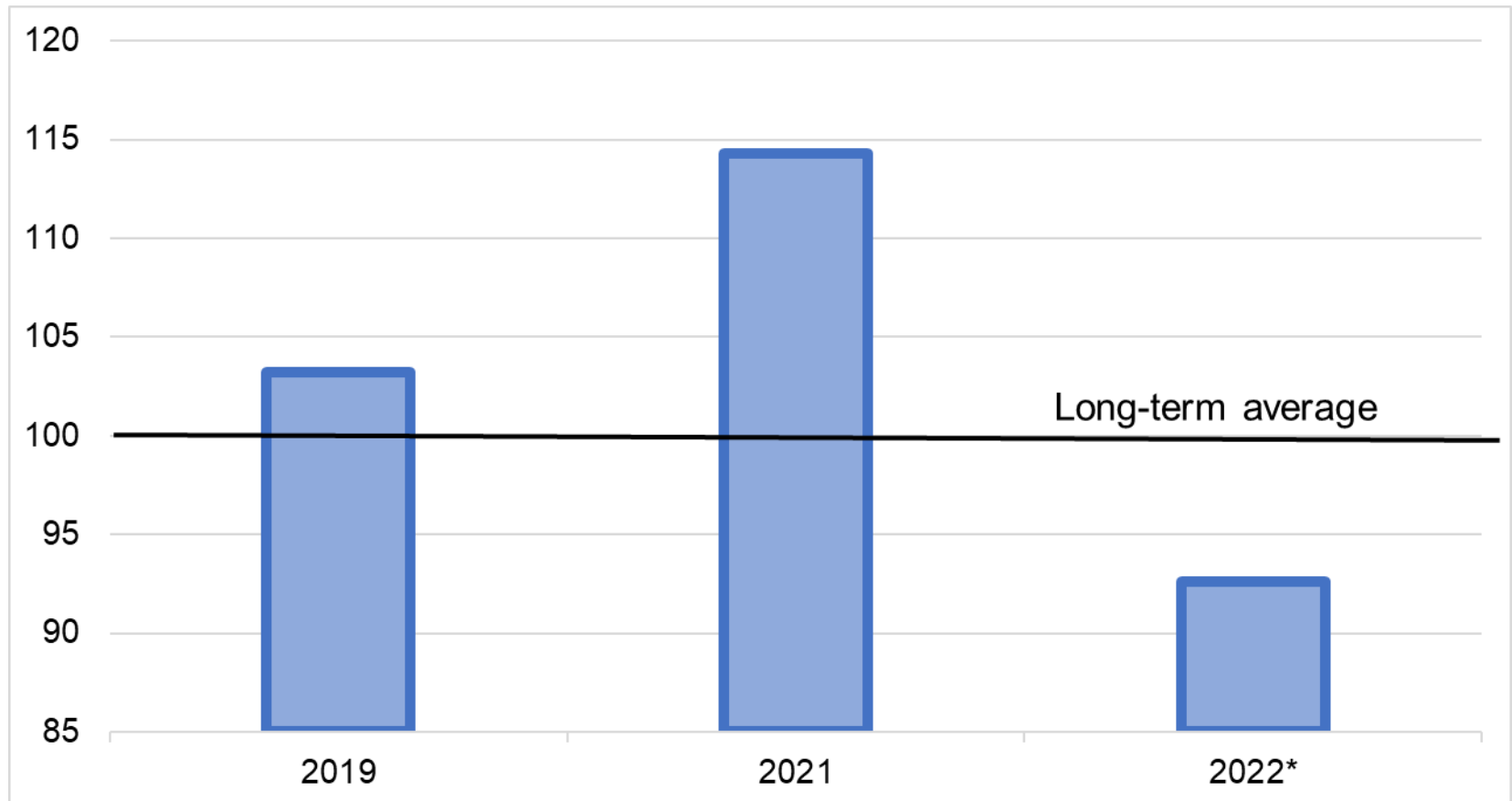

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# Economic Sentiment Indicator in the EU

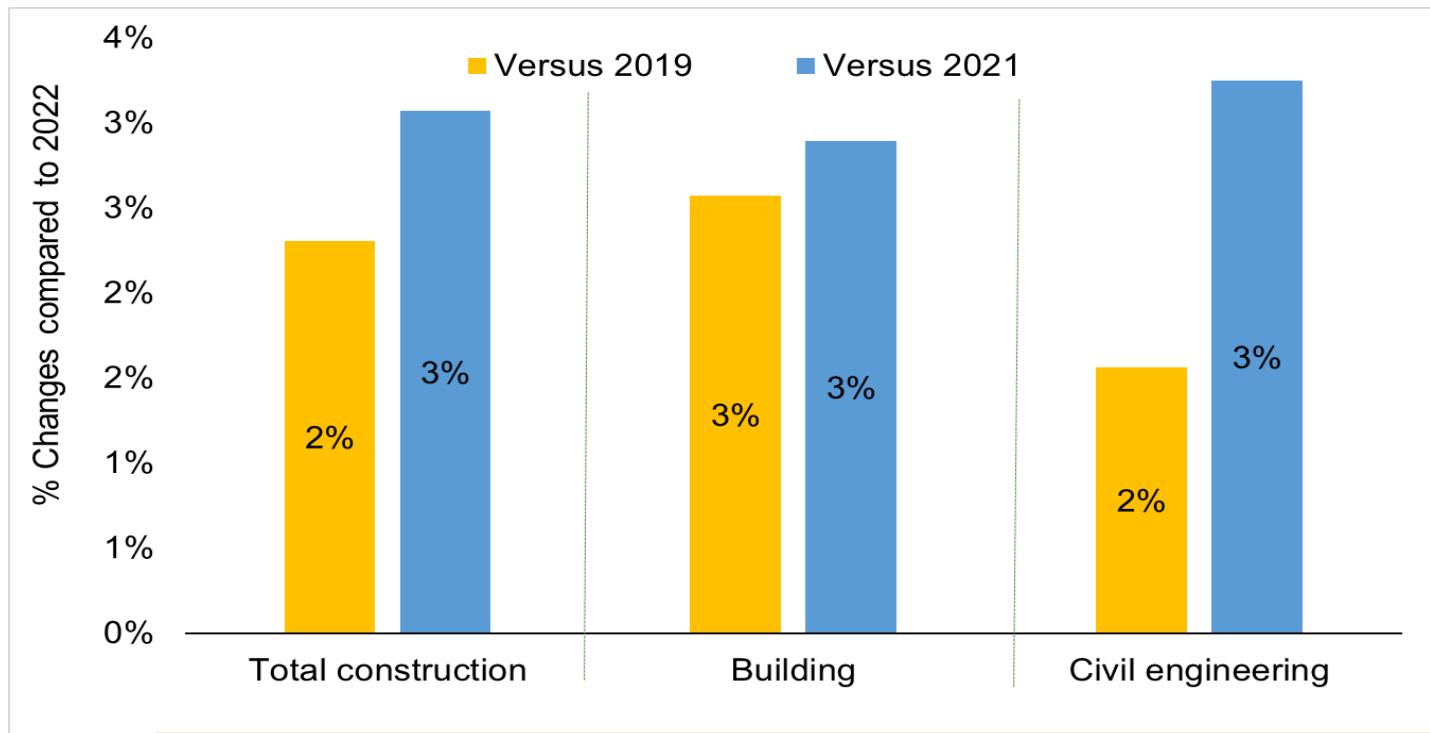

% Changes compared to 2022 (volume wise: calendar and seasonally adjusted)



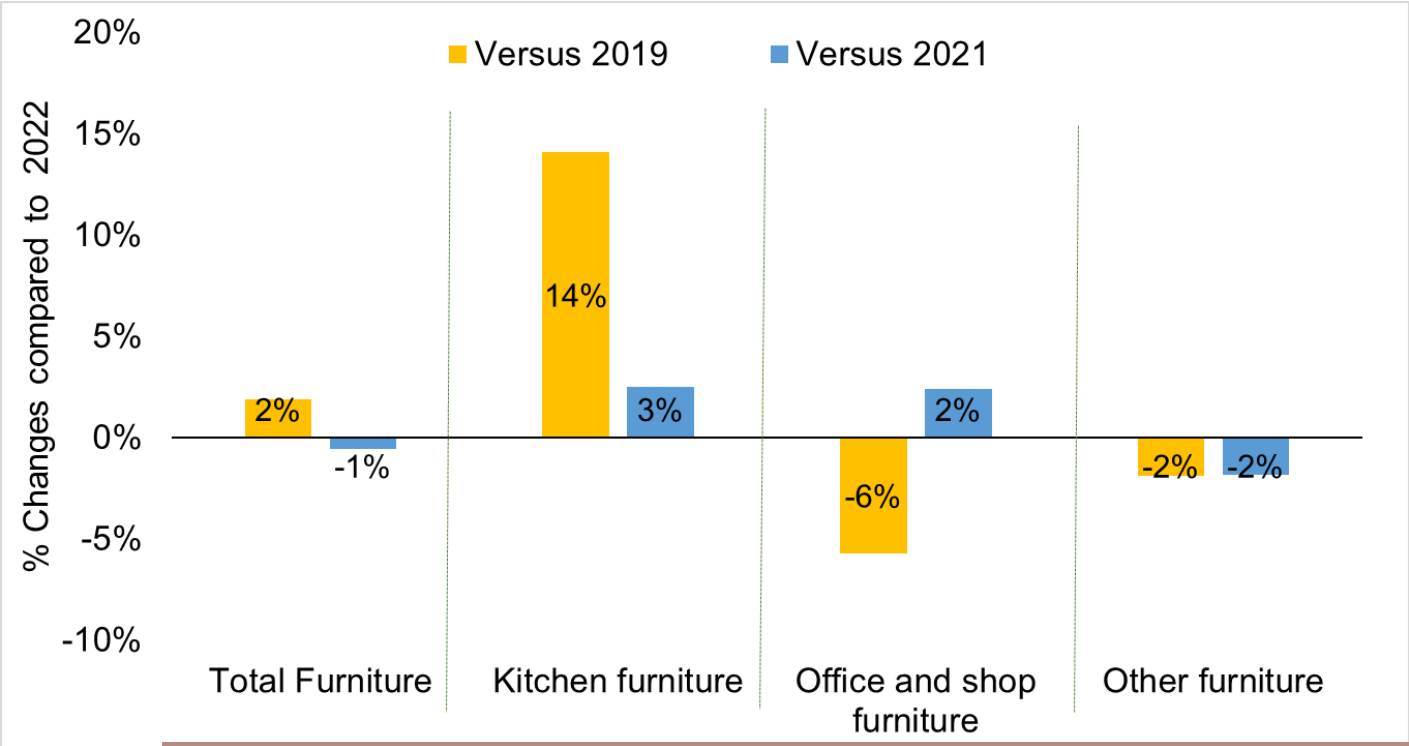
- Availability of public funds supporting civil engineering construction in 2022

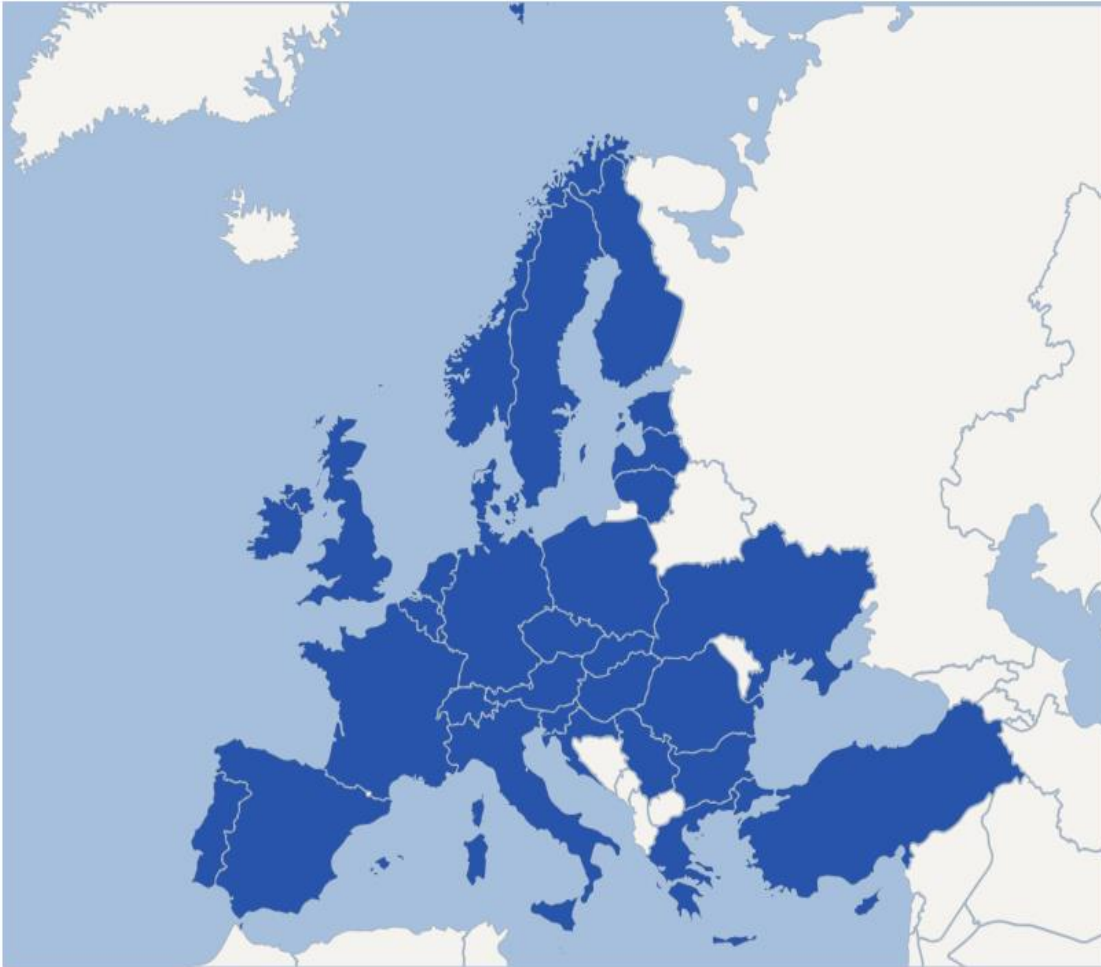

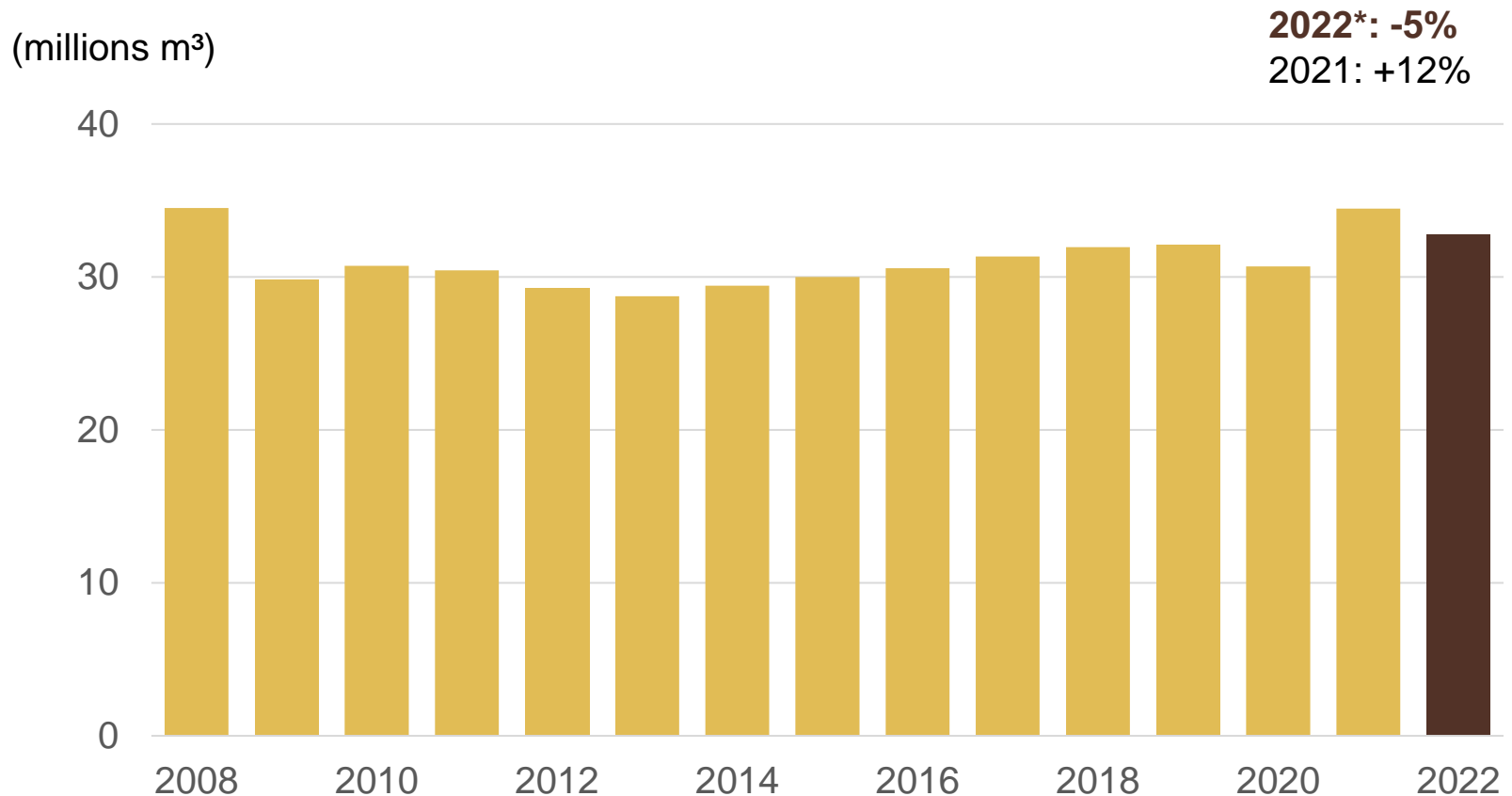

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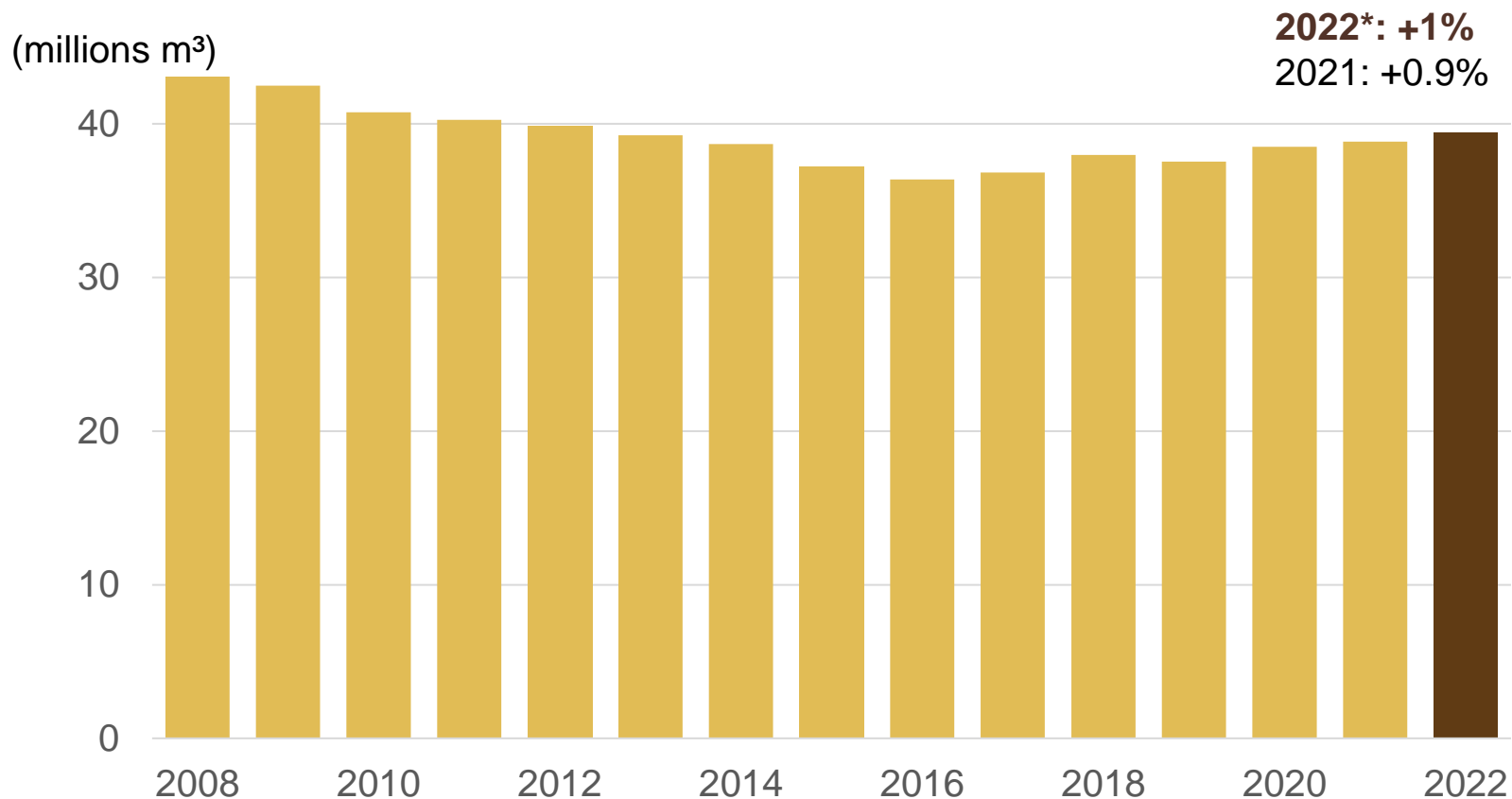
# Particleboard Production in EU27+UK+EFTA

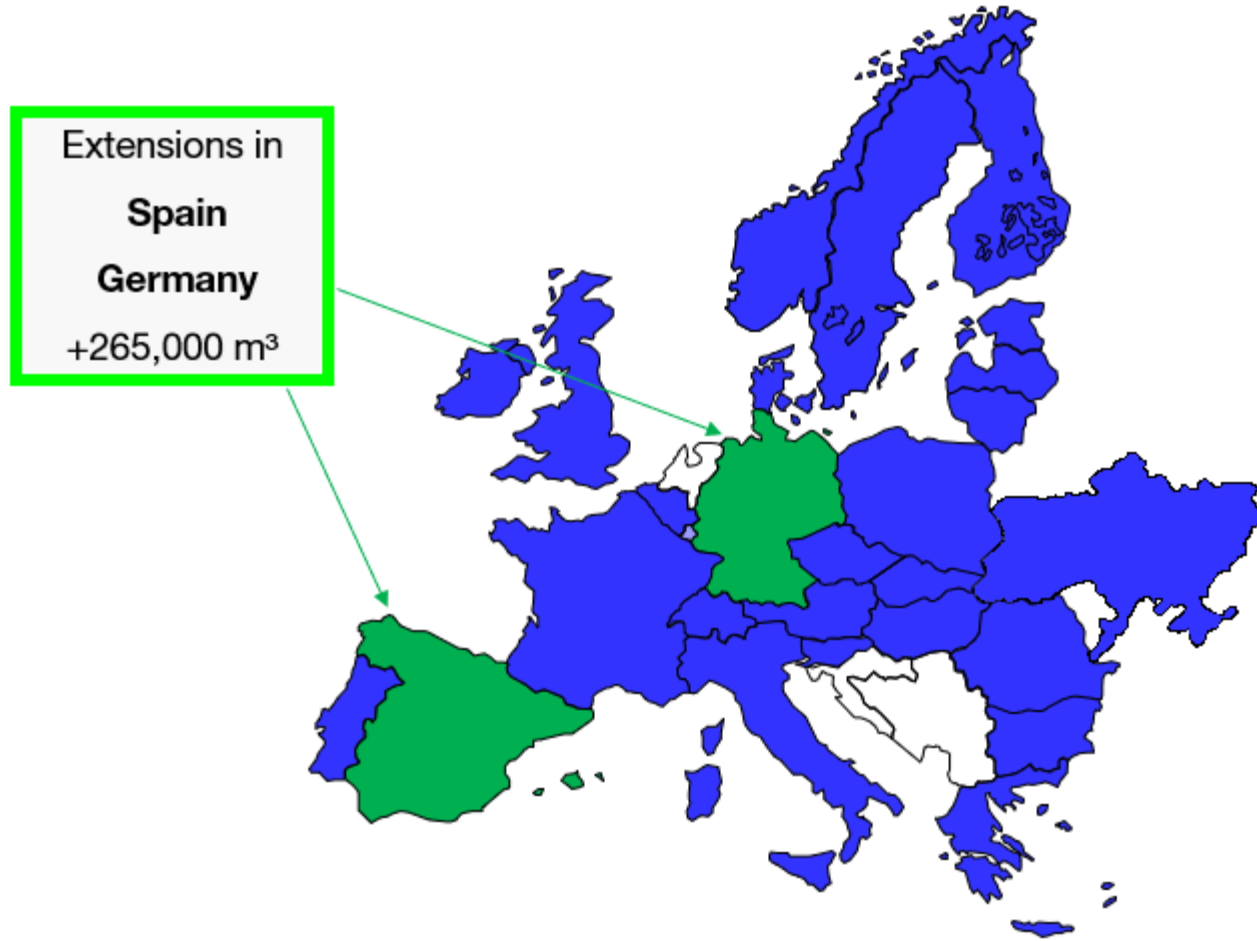
# Particleboard Production capacity in EU27+UK+EFTA

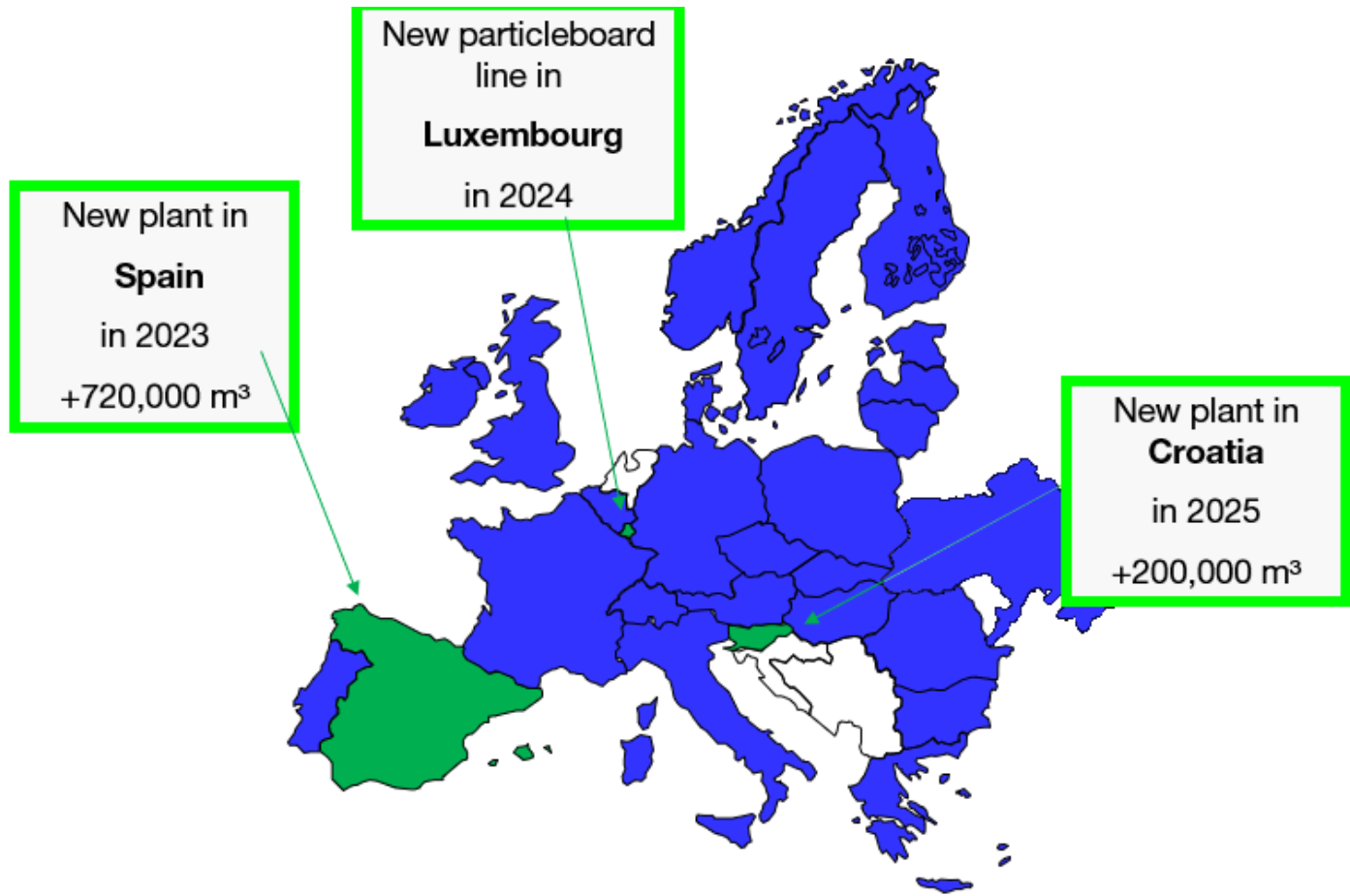

# Particleboard Announced Plant Extensions in 2022

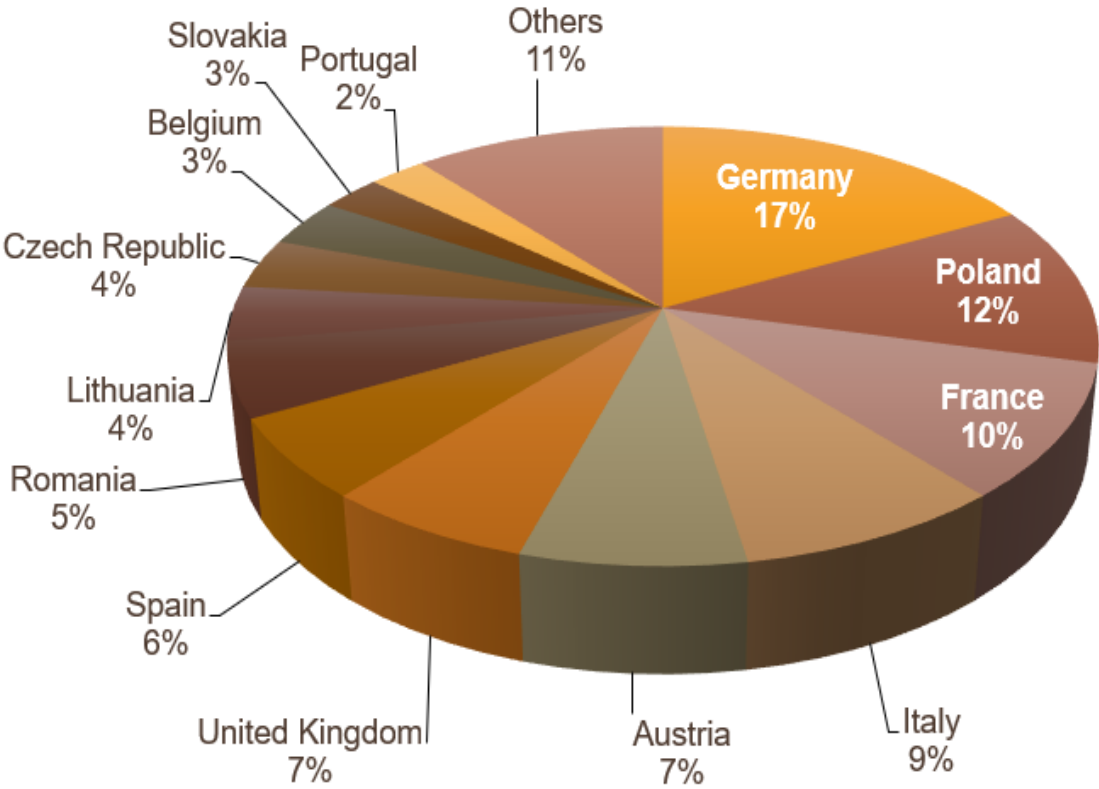

# Share of Particleboard Production by Country 2022





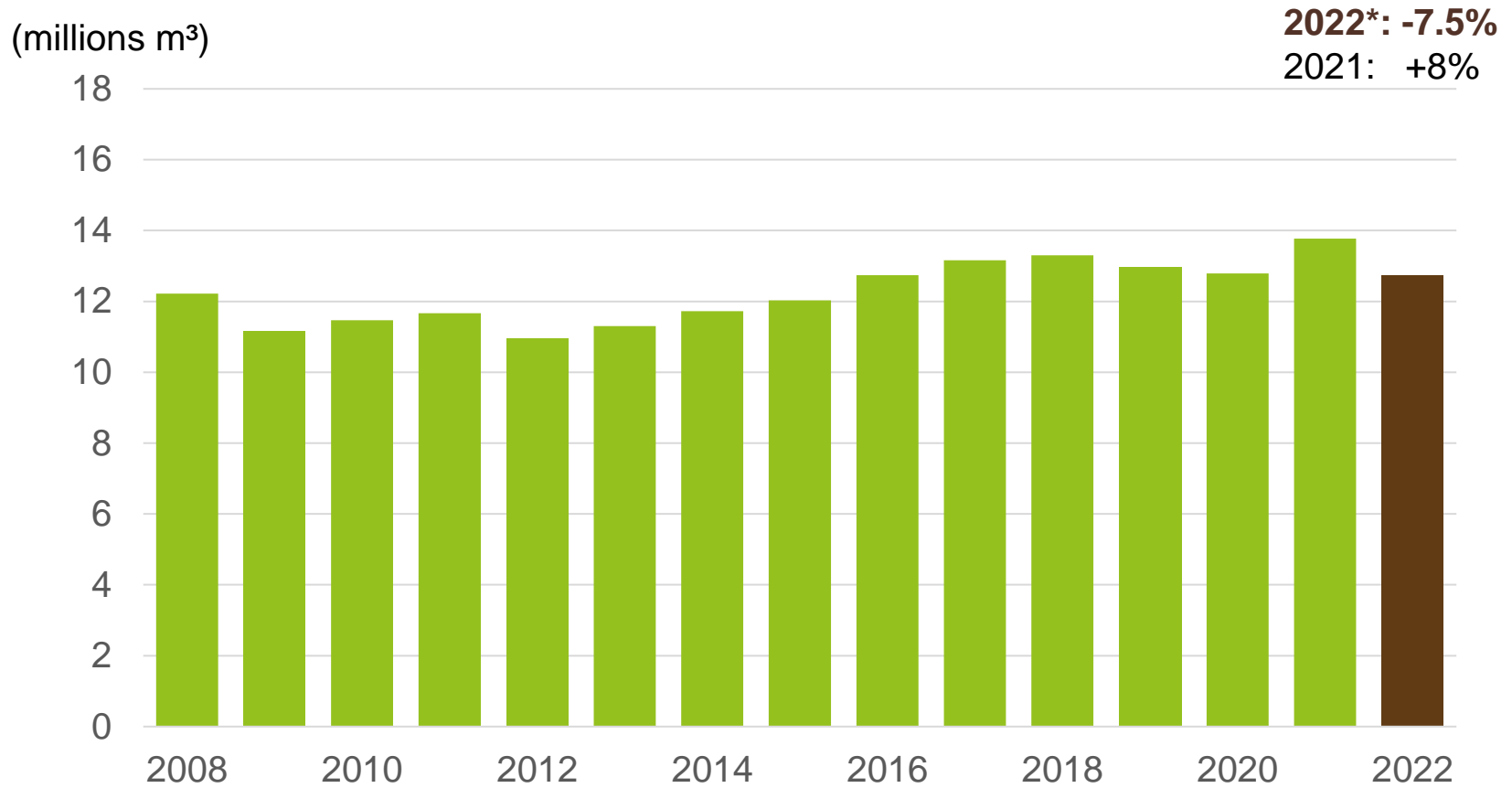

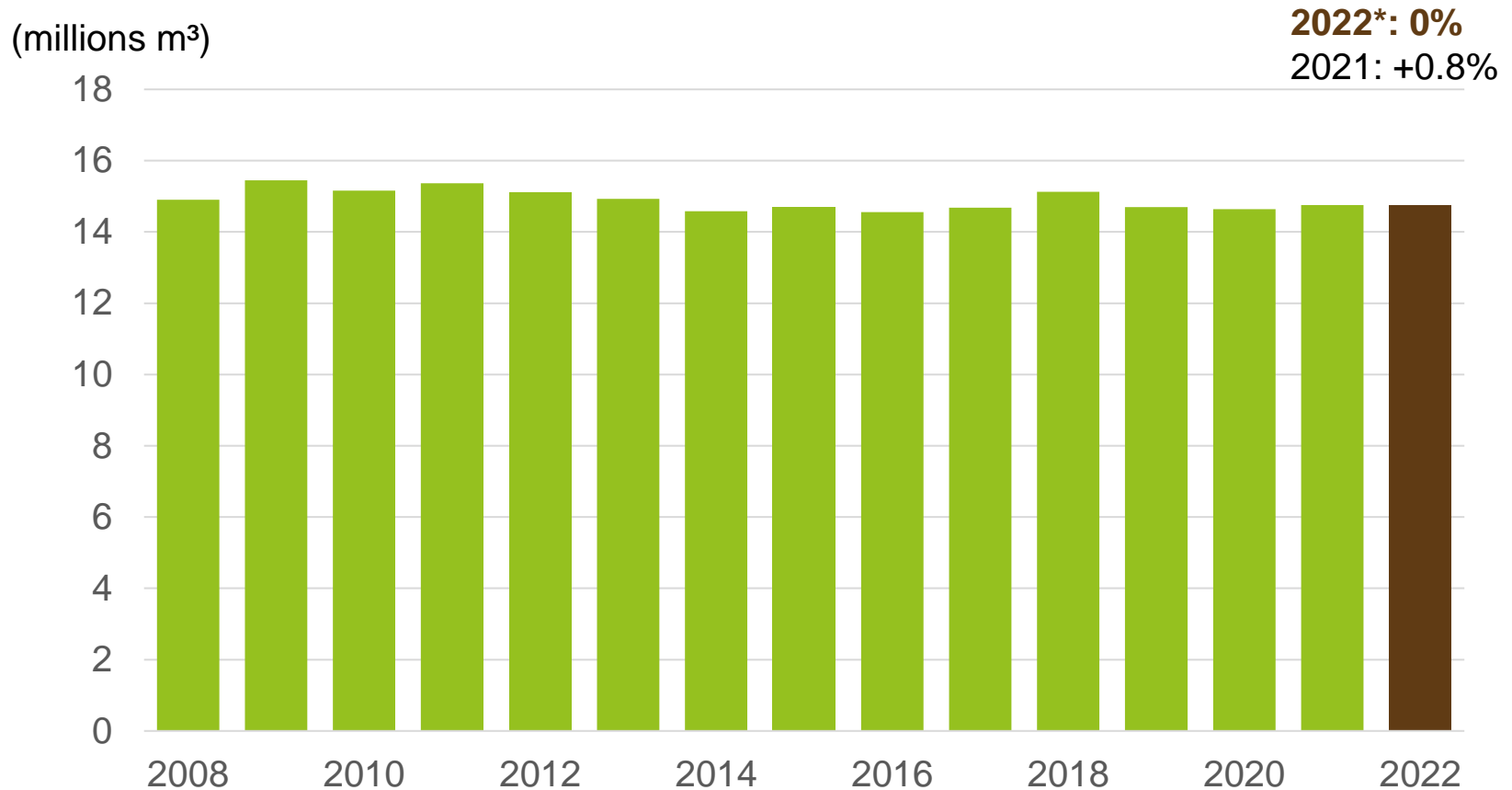

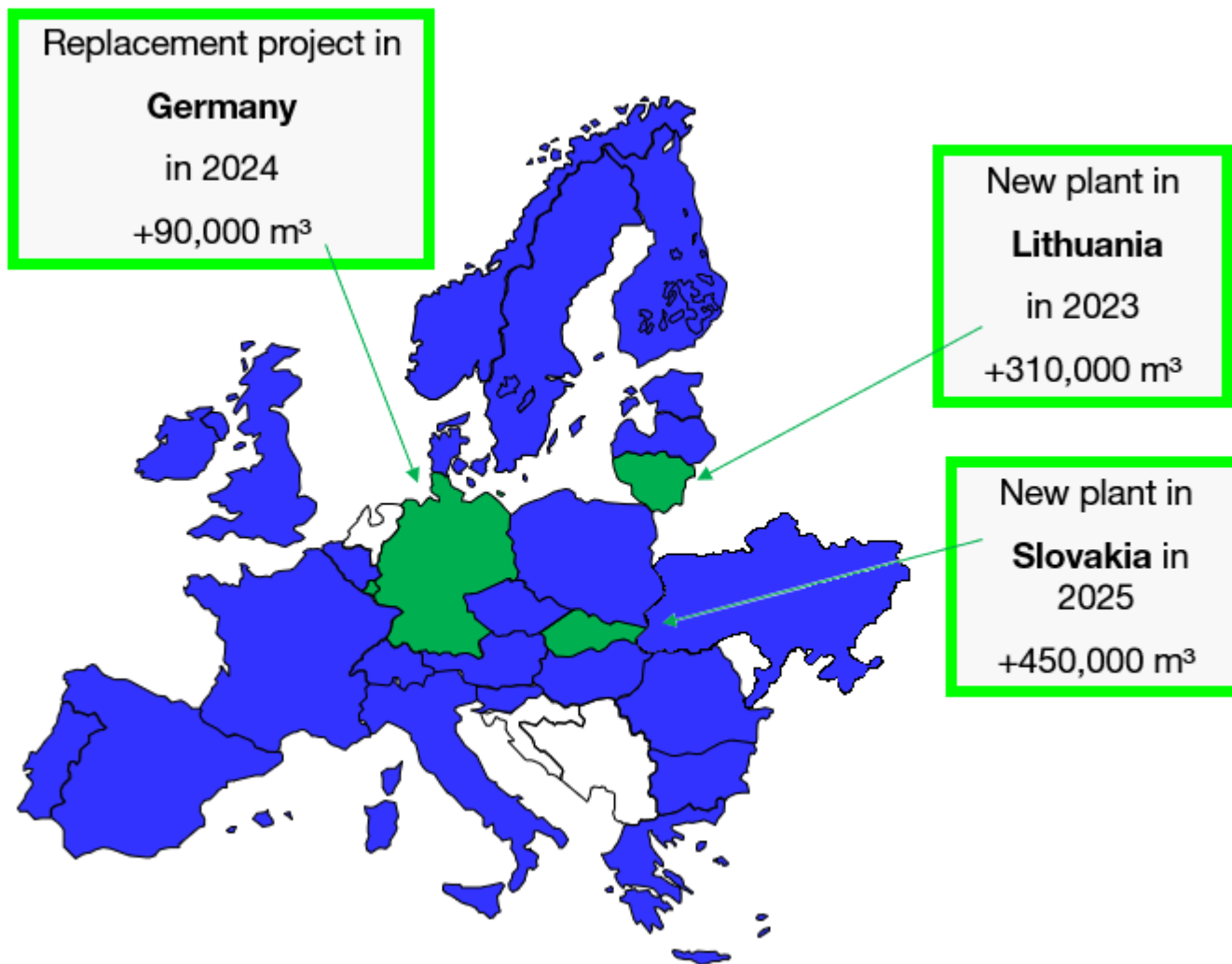
# MDF – production capacity in EU27+UK+EFTA

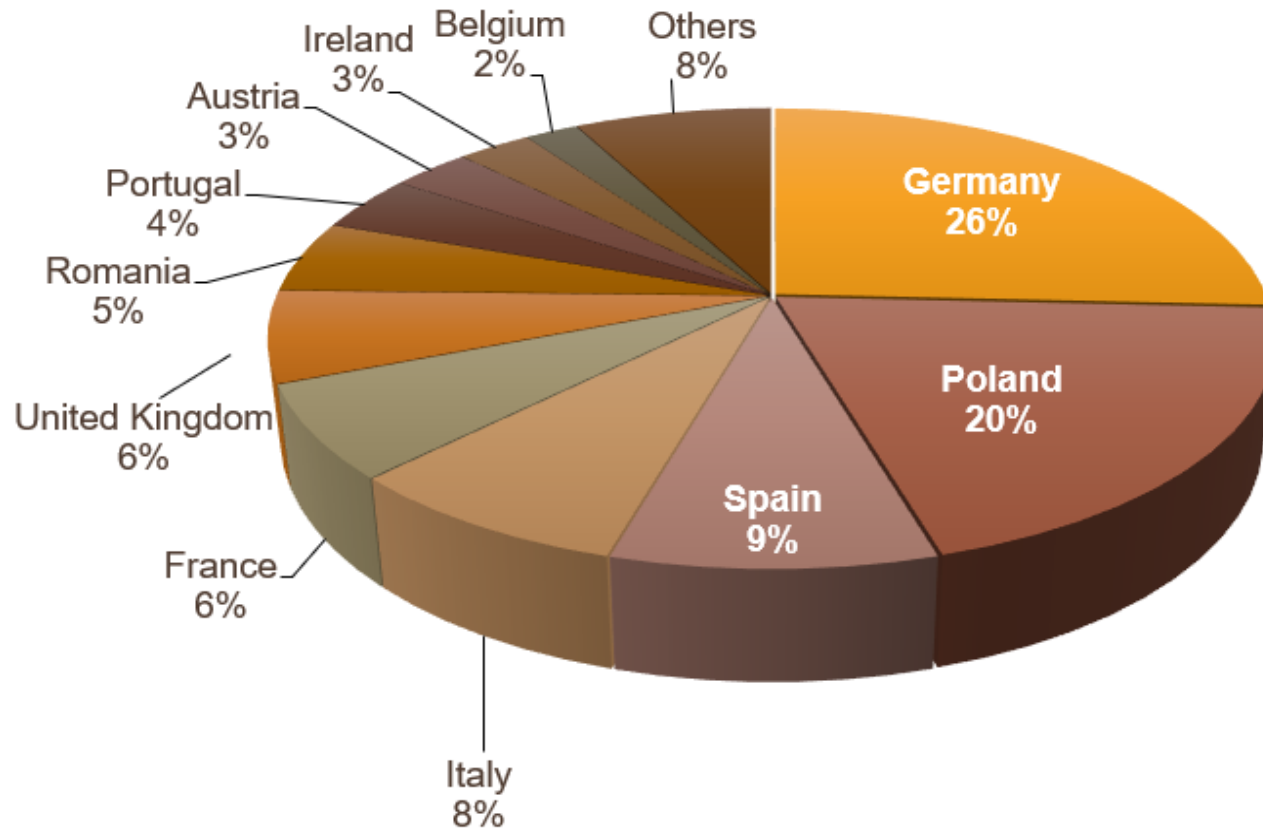

# Share of MDF Production Capacity by Country 2022





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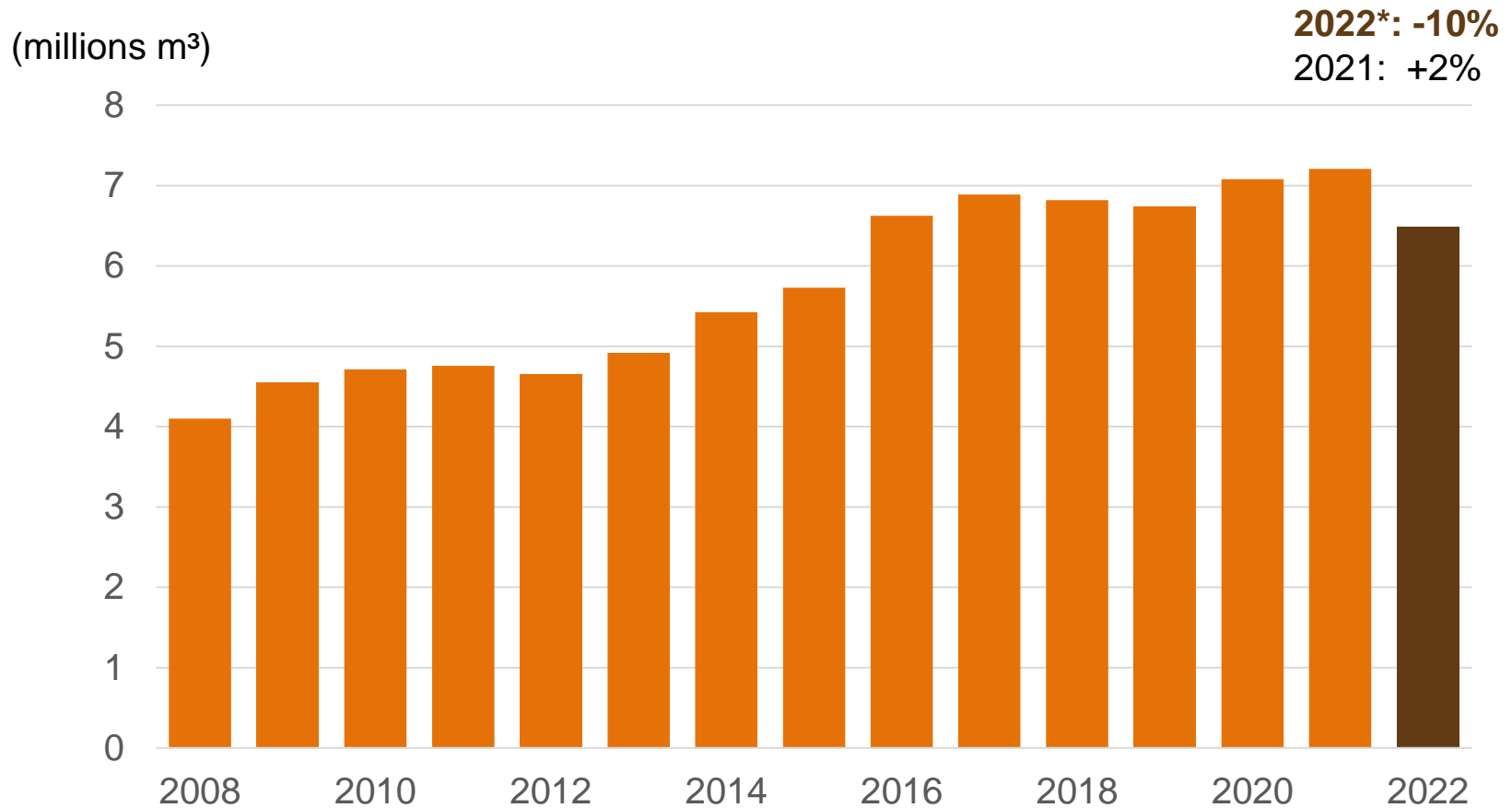

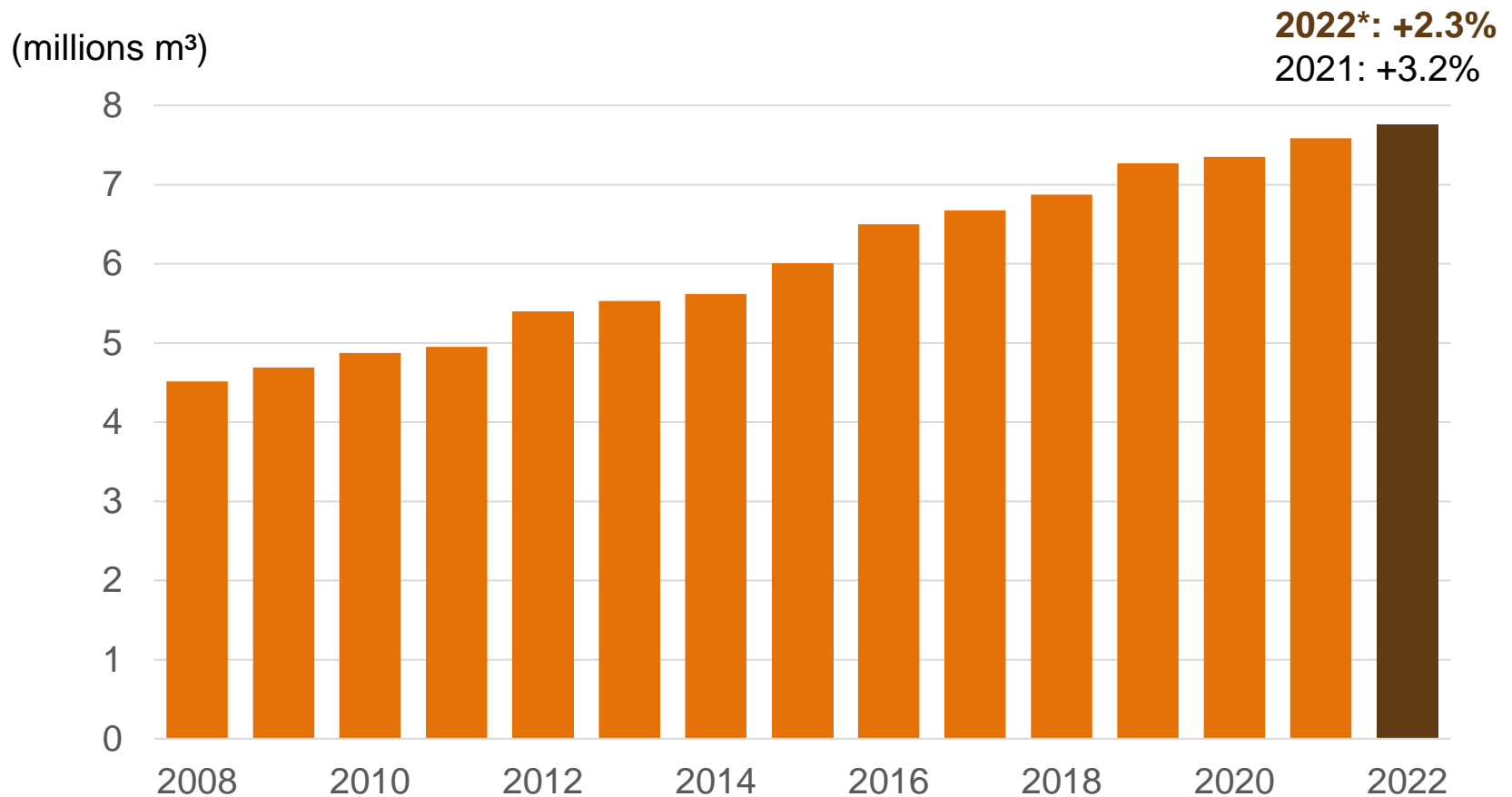

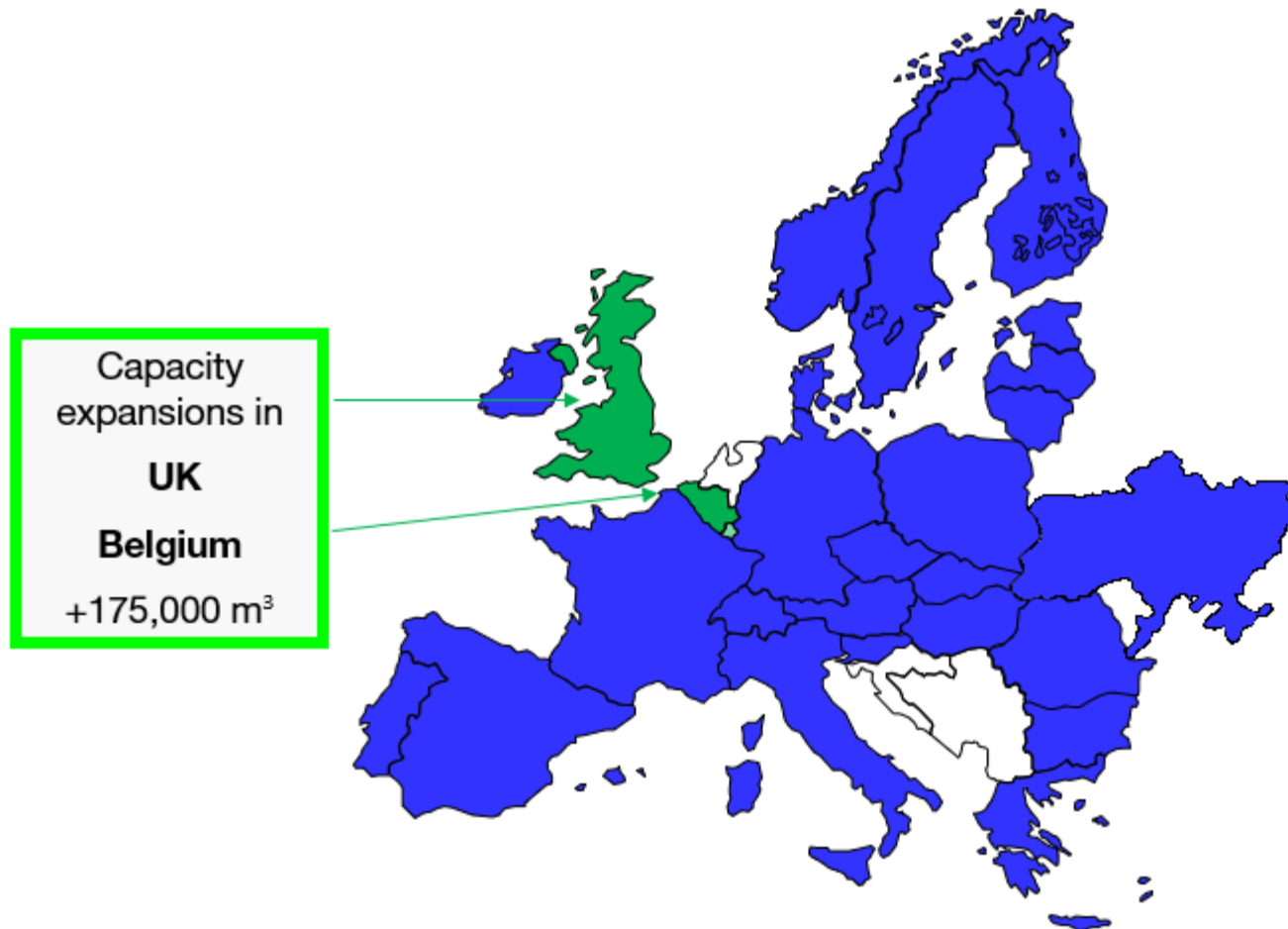
## Production capacity in EU27+UK+EFTA

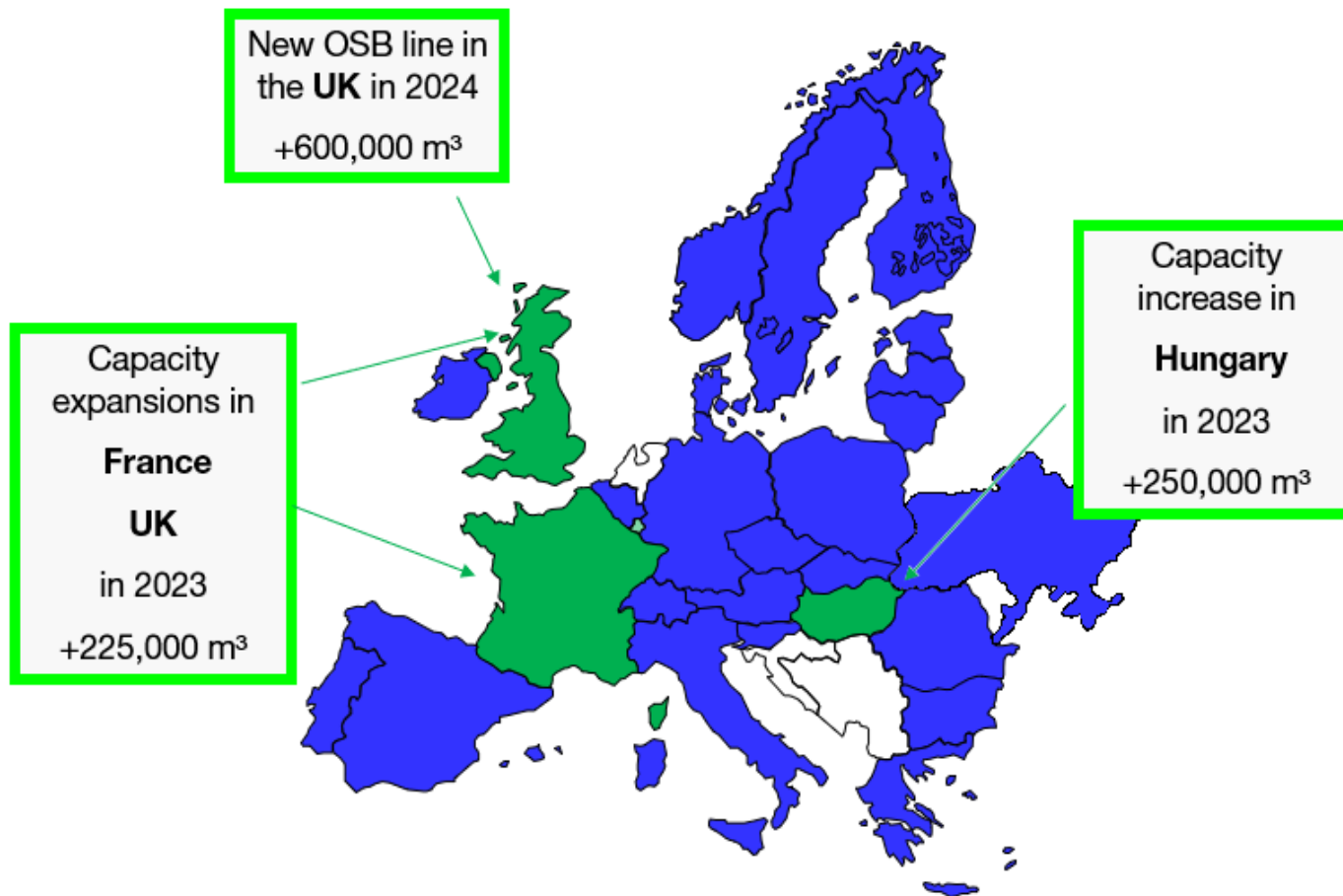

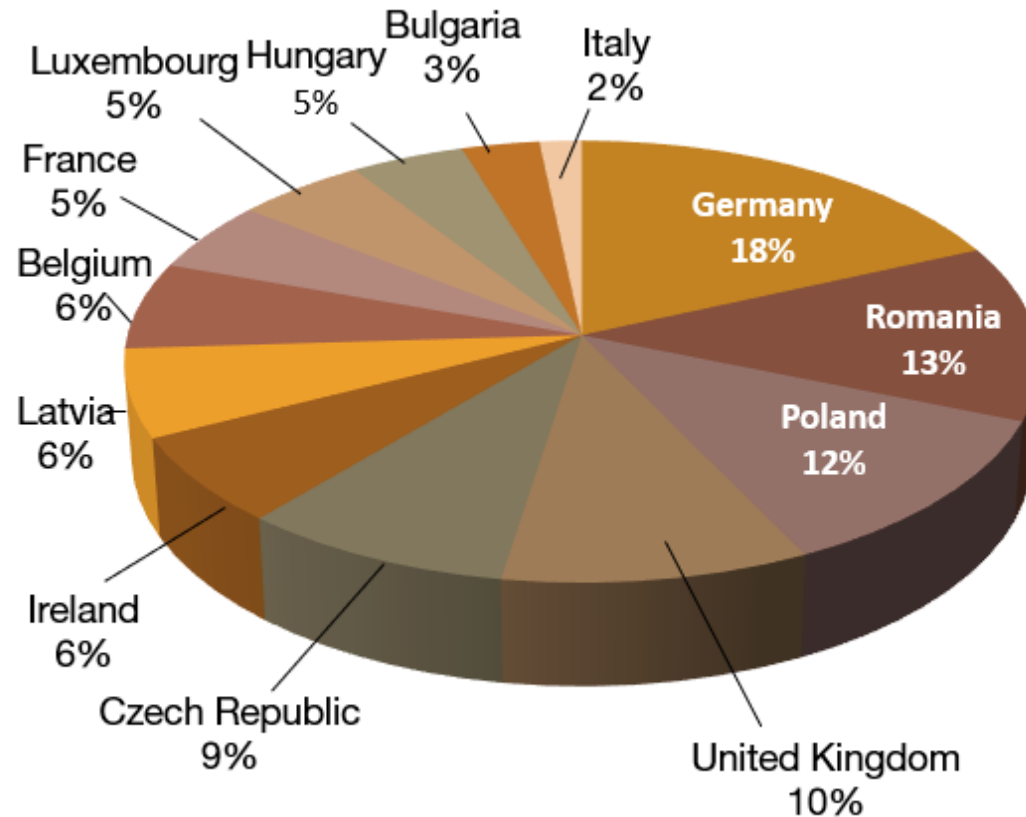

# Share of OSB Production Capacity by Country 2022





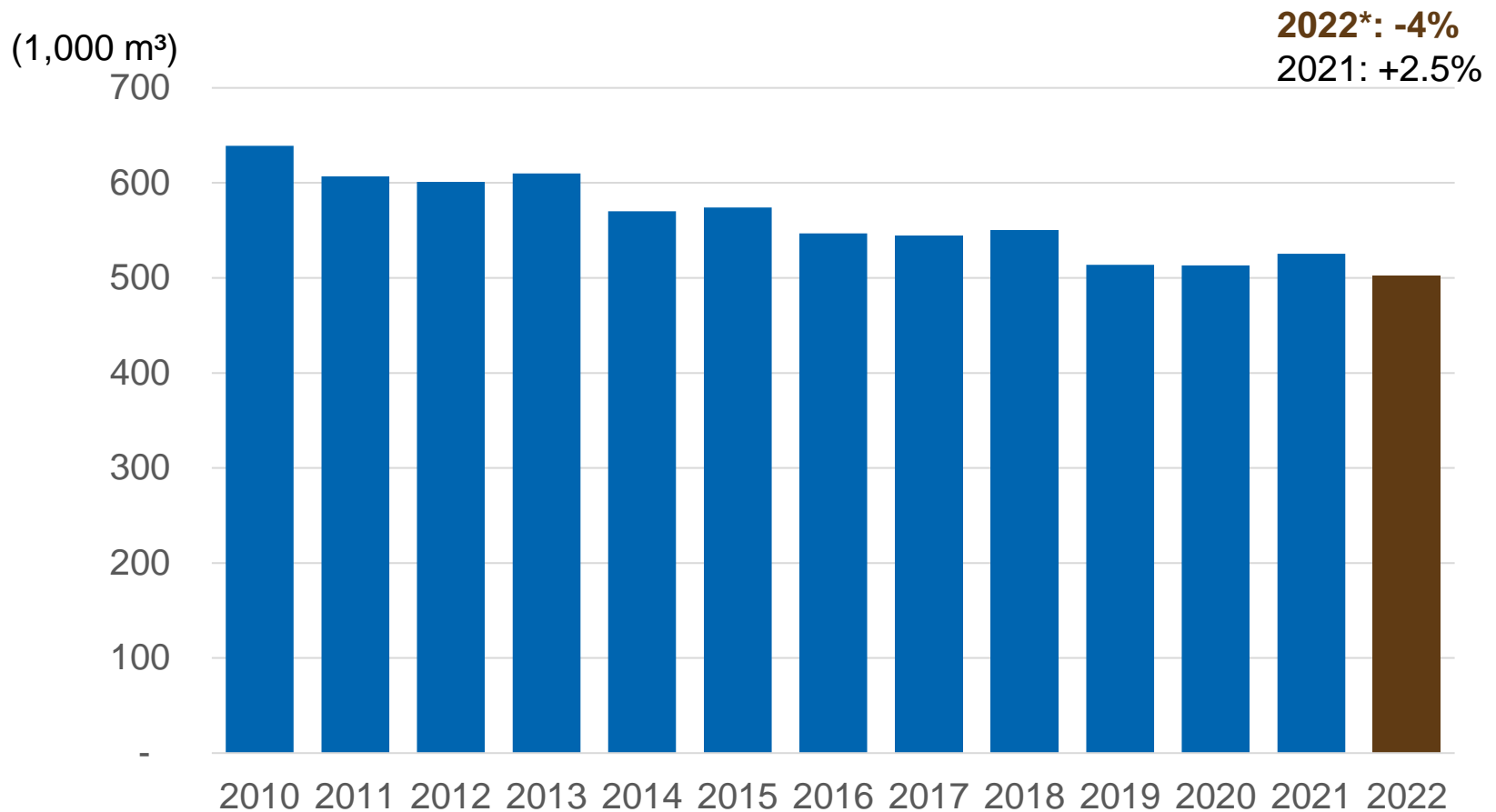

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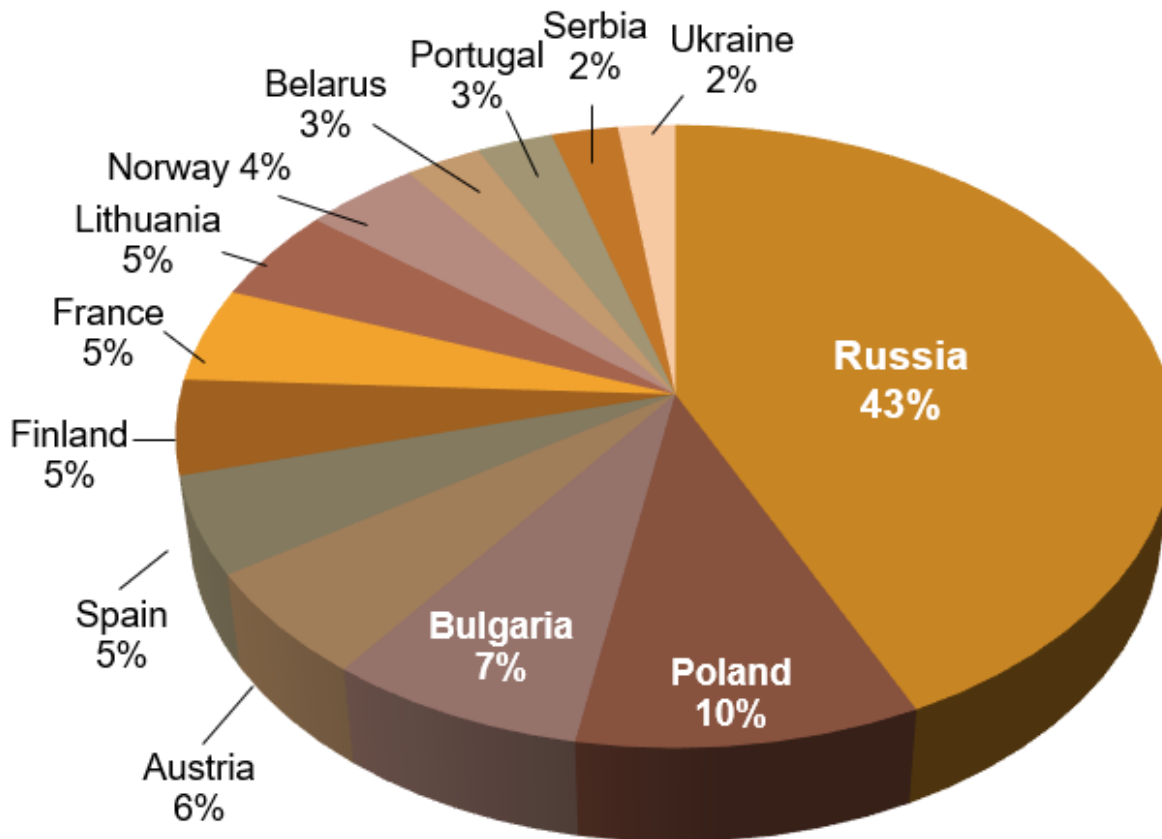

# Share of Hardboard Production Capacity by Country (Including RU, BY, SR, UA) 2022





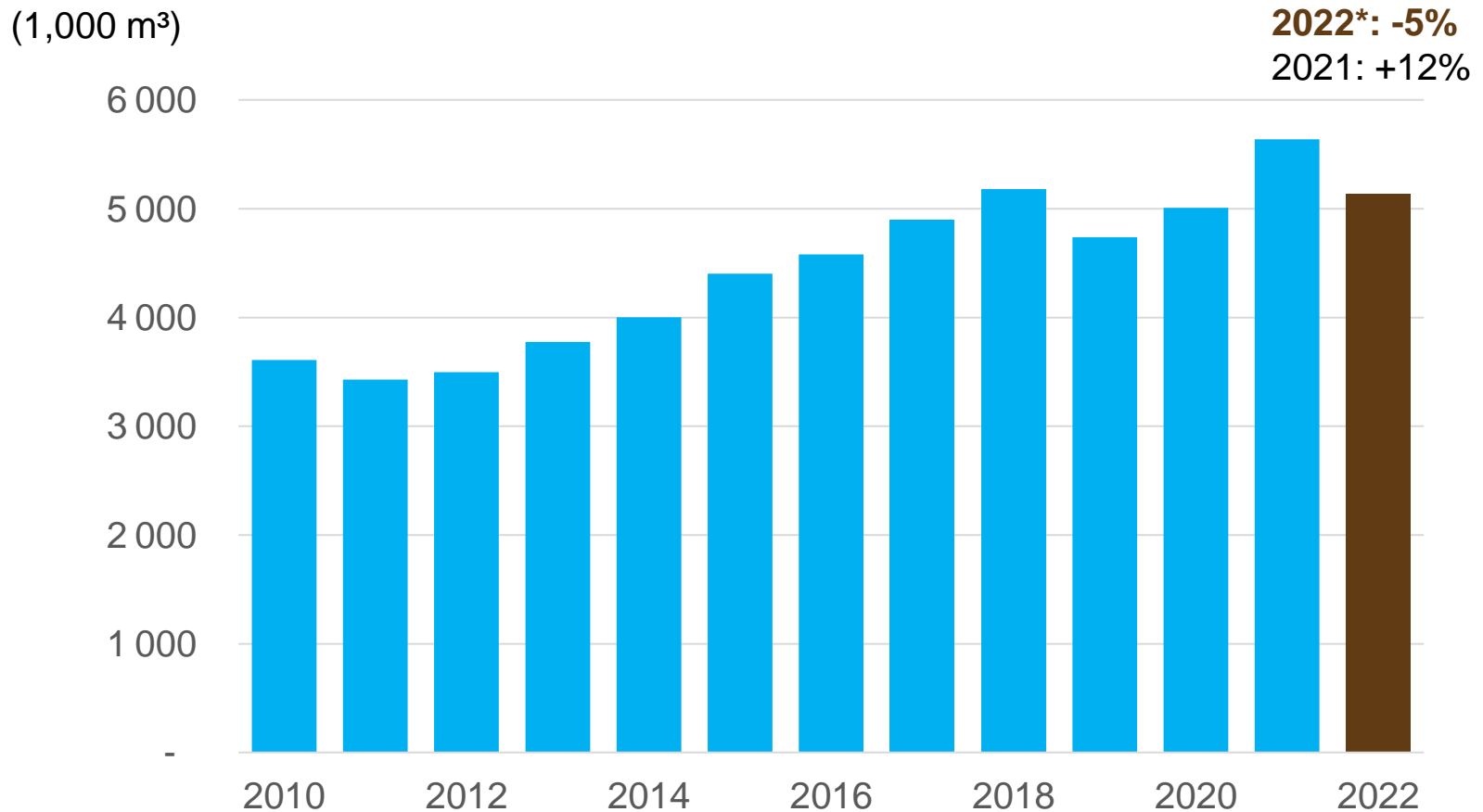

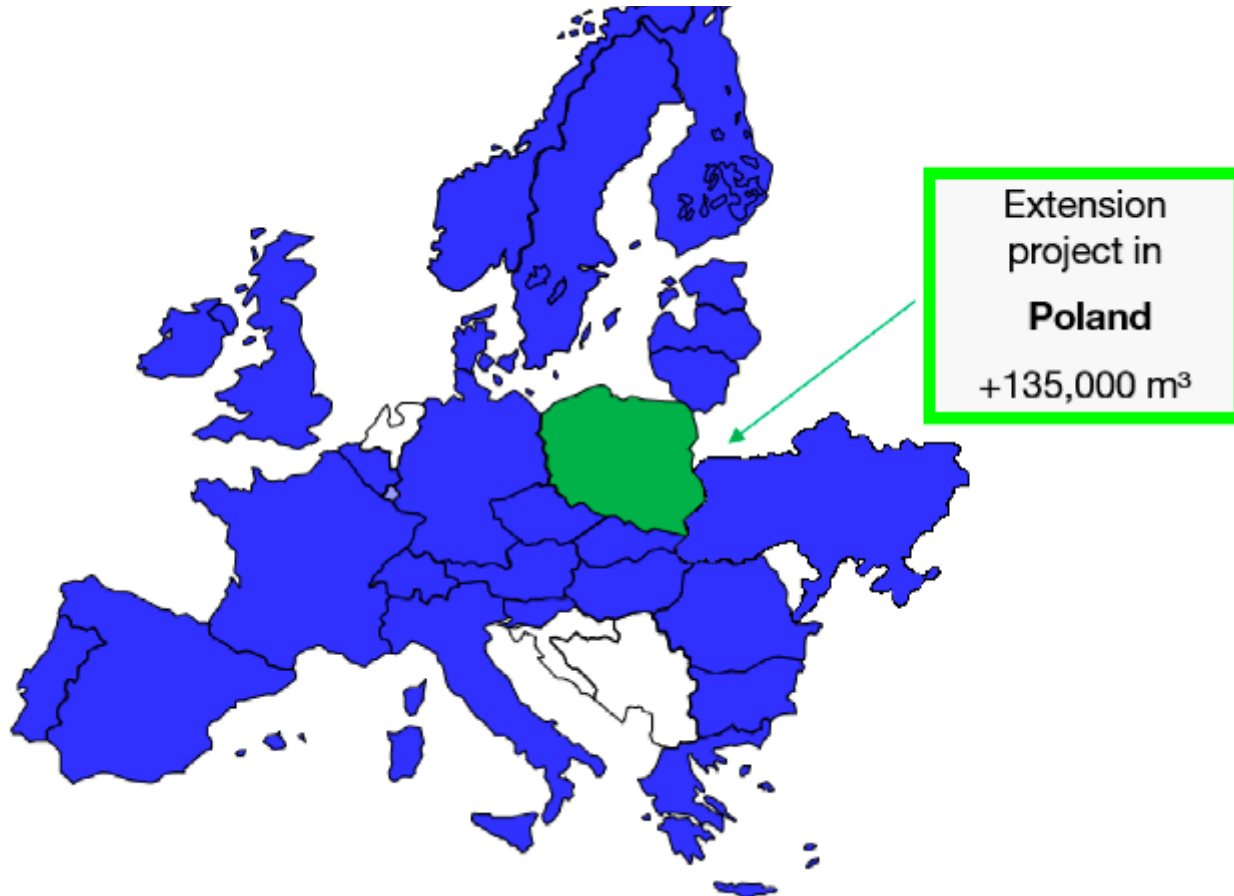

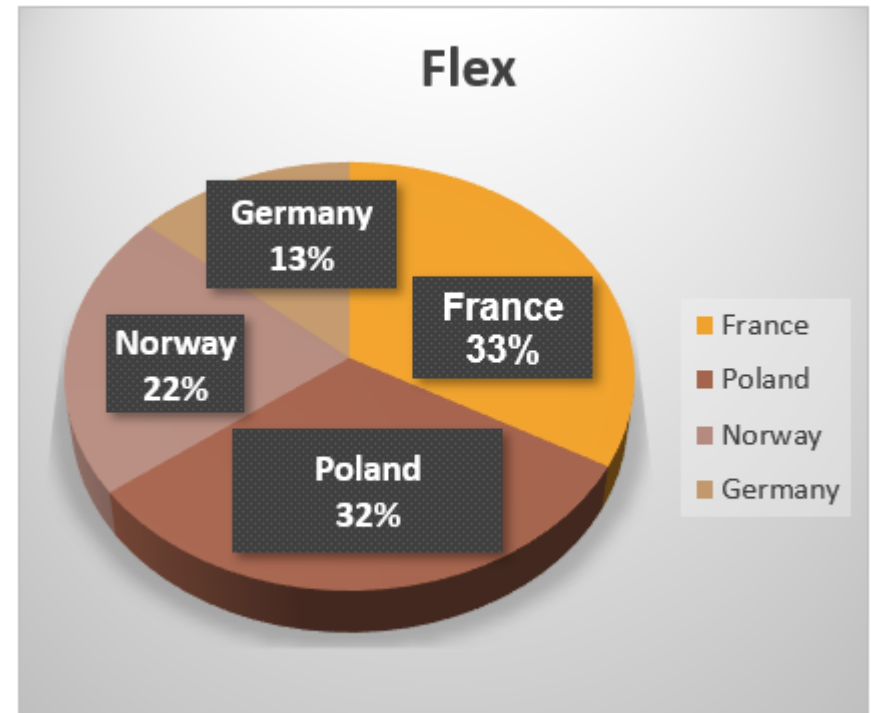

# Share of Softboard Production Capacity by Country 2022





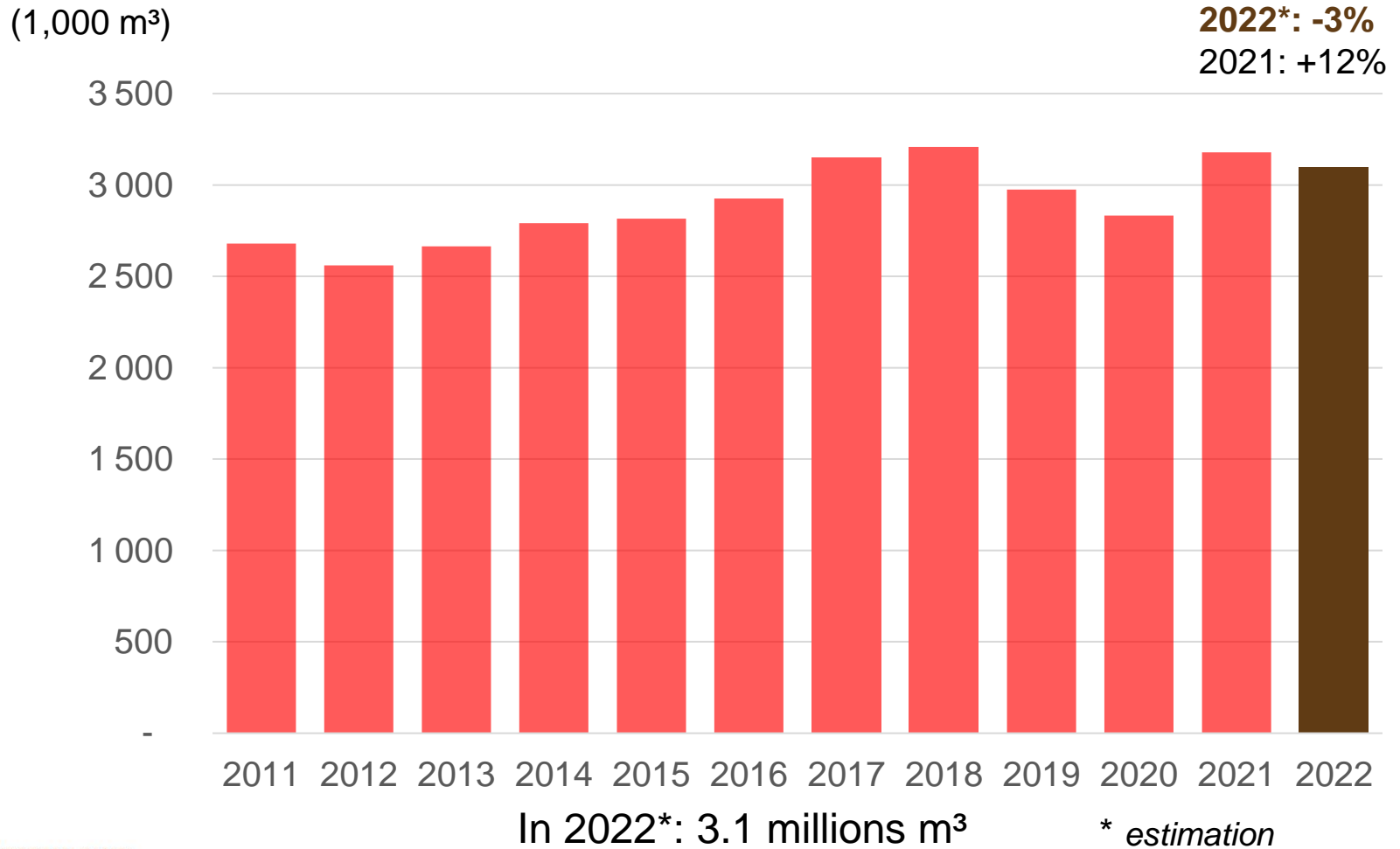
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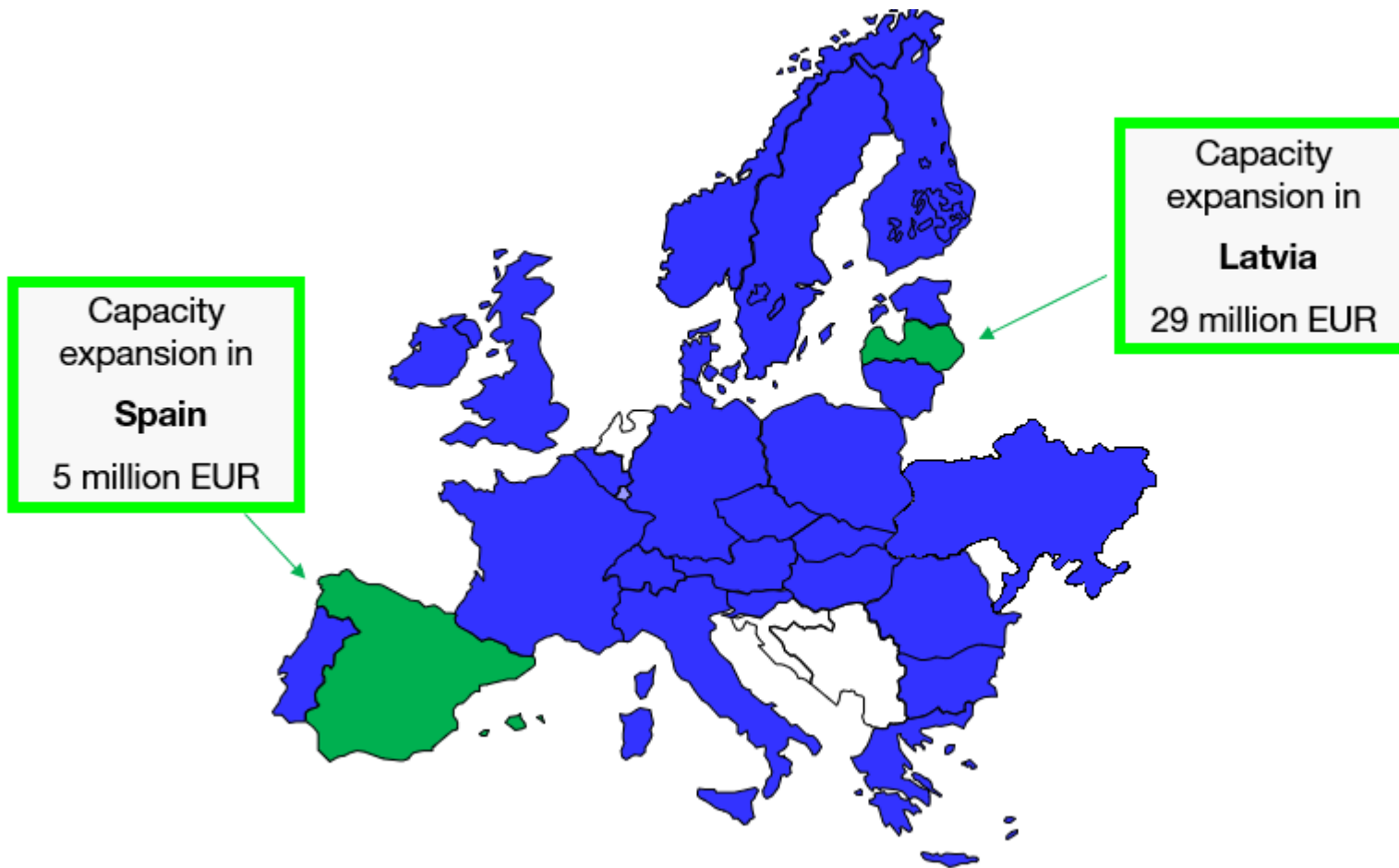

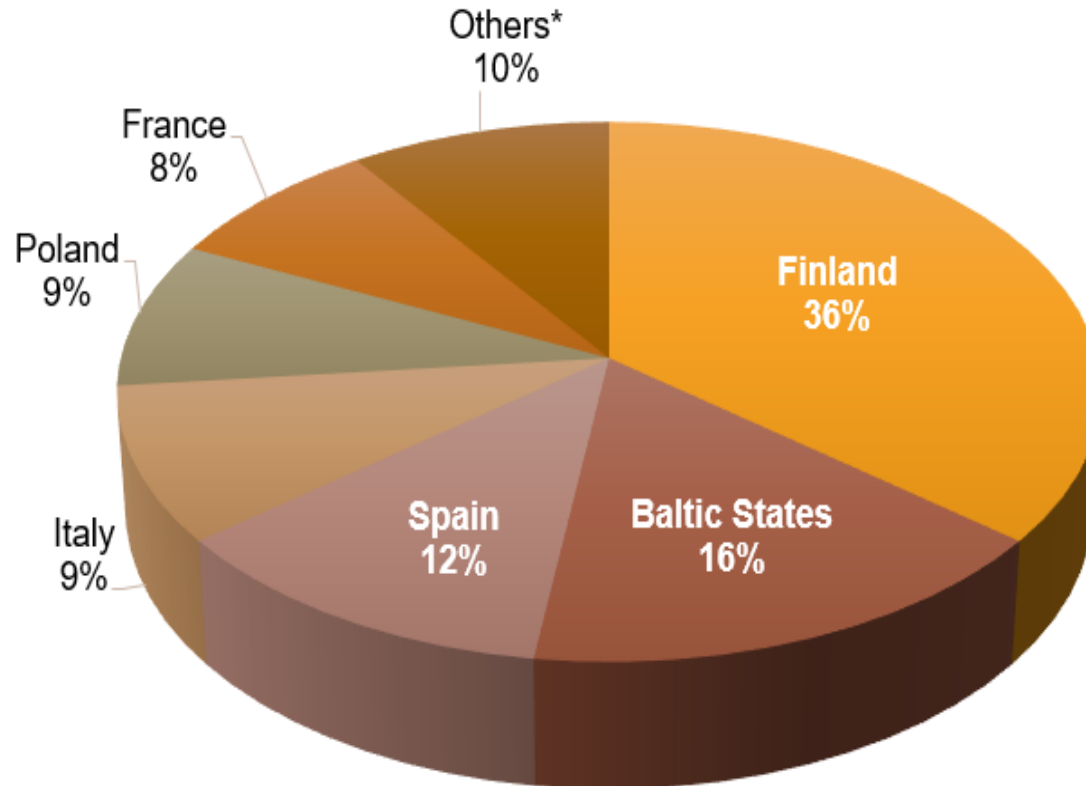


# Plywood Announced Capacity Expansion in 2023 and beyond

# Share of Plywood production by country (EU-27 only) 2022





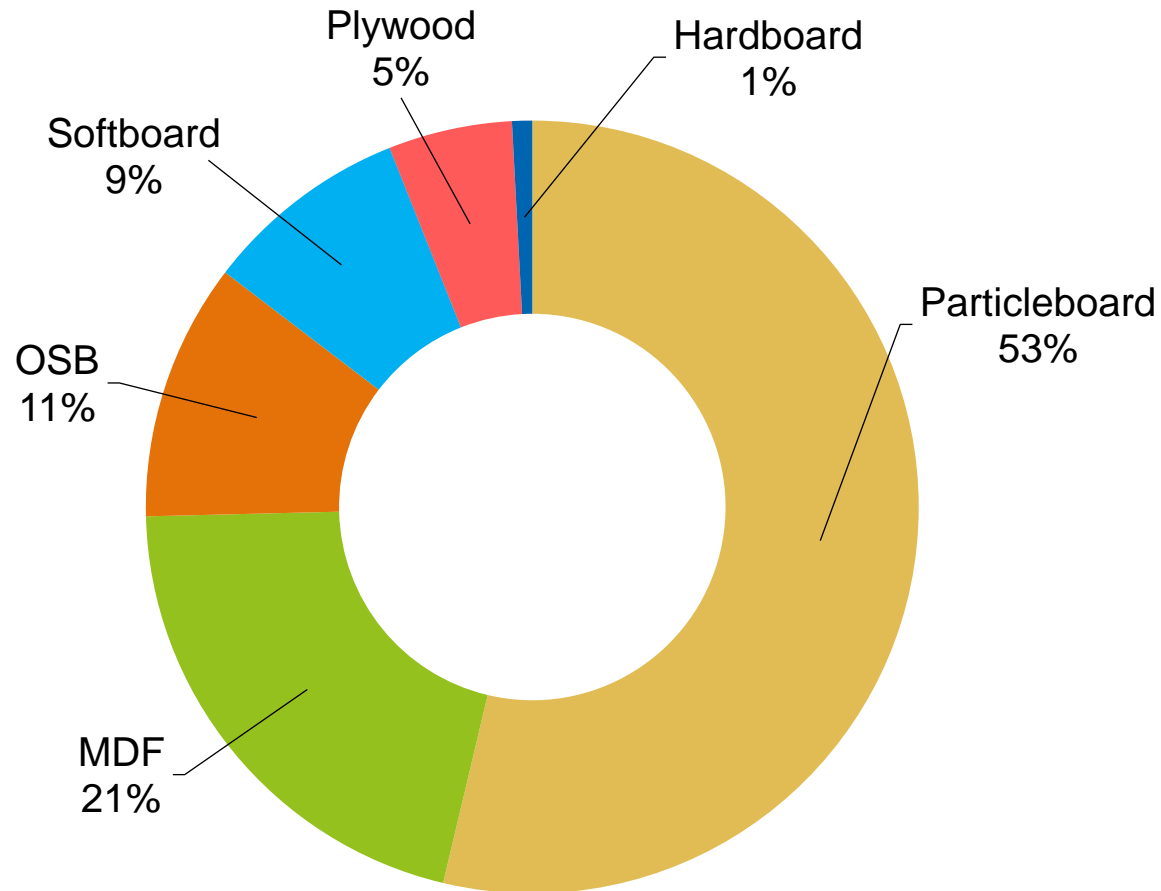

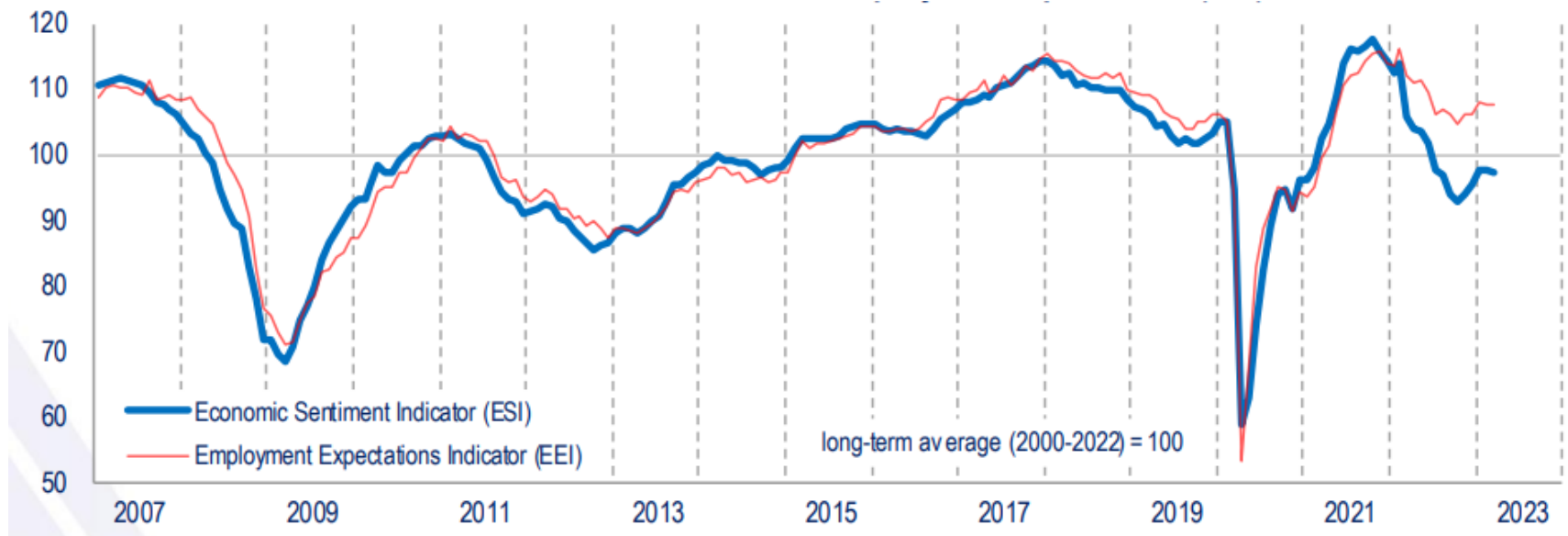
# Outlook 2023

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- Despite declining from the peak, energy prices remain elevated
- Higher financing costs as a result of rising interest rates
- Uncertainty around the consequences of the current banking turmoil on the real economy
- Consumer confidence remaining poor: construction and furniture markets being affected

# Economic Sentiment Indicator in EU

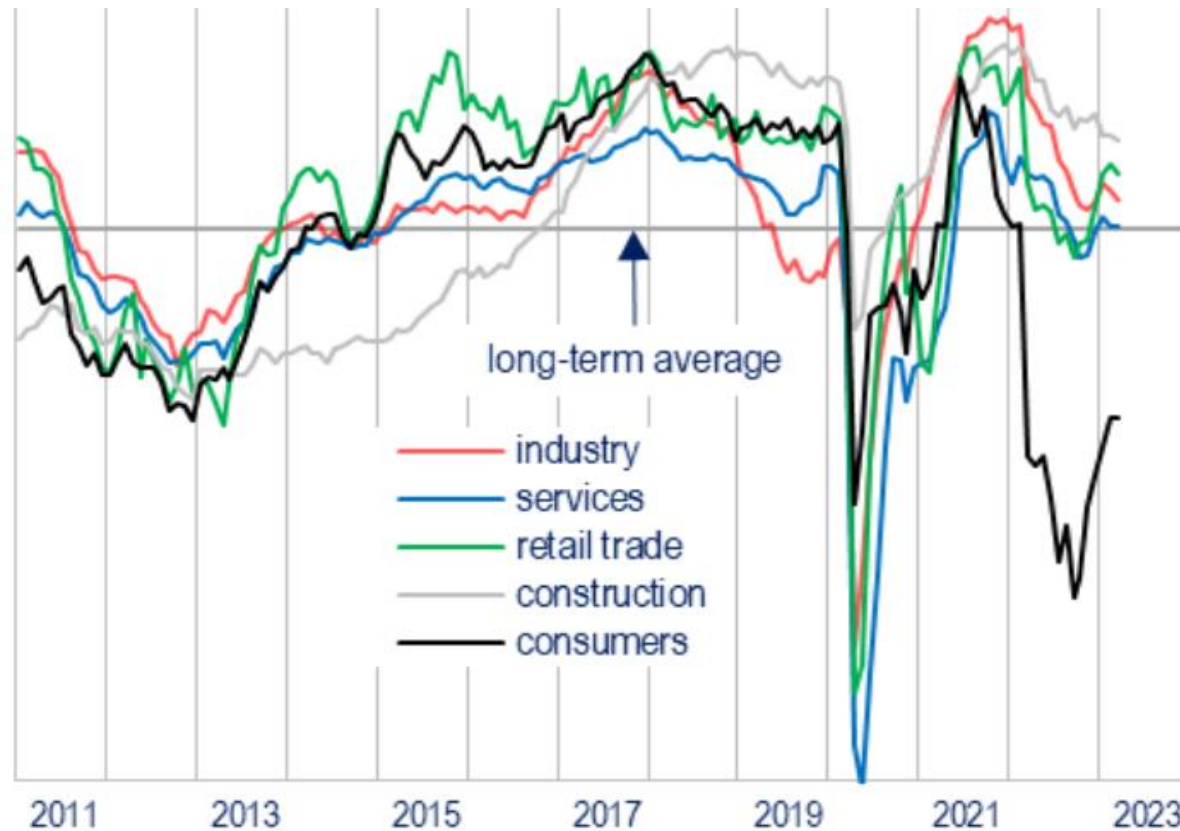
## March 2023

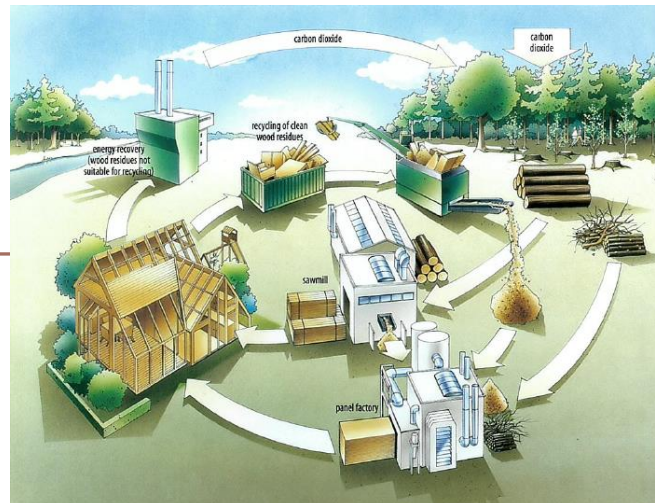
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# Highlight 1

## Cascade in legislation (RED III) (5SD - Climate)



## 3 positive changes in RED III

- 1) **Cascade in legislation for the first time** - woody biomass to be used according to its highest economic and environmental added value (according to previous EC guidelines on good practice)
  - 2) **Subsidies restricted** - Financial support will be banned for energy produced through the use of saw logs, veneer logs, industrial grade roundwood, and stumps and roots
  - 3) **Sustainability criteria increased** – will apply to smaller installations (equal or above 7.5 MW) rather than the 20 MW threshold under the current directive
- But devil is in the detail and beware derogations for MS's ....

# EPF & Wood4Bauhaus Alliance - Recap

- **Sept 2020:** President von der Leyen calls for use of wood to decarbonise the built environment (carbon source -> sink)
- February 2021: EPF and Innovawood form Wood4Bauhaus Alliance as a community of industry, research and trade unions
- April 2021: 1200 delegates attend Wood4Bauhaus online conference calling to “Reforest our planet, retimber our cities”
- May 2022: W4B meets Shigeru Ban and Bauhaus Earth
- June 2022: InnoRenew hosts W4B side event of NEB Festival
- **June 2022: President VDL quotes Pope Francis’ call for greater wood in construction at NEB event in the Vatican**

## Material Use of Wood (45 -> 60%)

### 5SD – Wood Availability



# Material use of wood must go up!

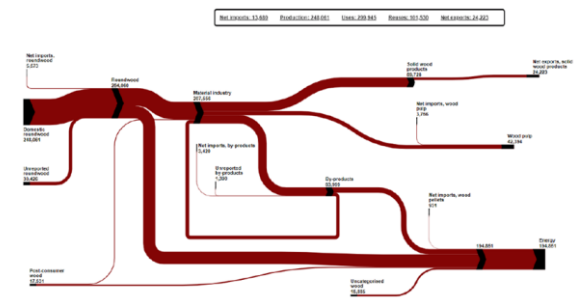
- EPF met with the Deputy Director General Maive Rute of DG GROW to discuss wood availability.



- **How much wood is there?**
  - 500 million m<sup>3</sup> harvested in 2021 in EU-27 (Eurostat)

- **What is it used for?**
  - 27% for wooden products
  - 13% for paper and pulp
  - 60% for energy

Figure 9. Woody biomass flows in the forest based sector, EU27, net trade, 2017 (1000 tdm).

- **Is it enough?**
  - Yes if we a) use it better (cascade) and b) plant trees (mobilise)
  - No, if we keep “burning the book of life before we have studied it....”

**=>This is why EPF calls for material use to rise from 40-45% → at least 60%**



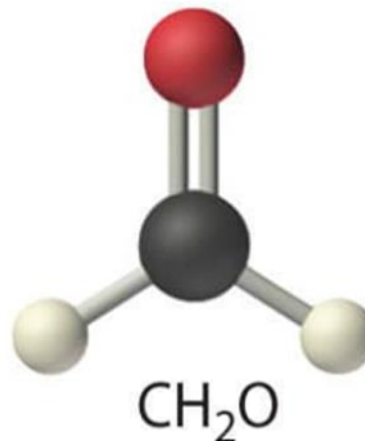

# Formaldehyde - Restriction Finalised

- **Ceiling (E1 Compulsory) and EU low emission level (New Standard) targets for EPF since 2015**
- REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and restriction of Chemicals) pathway. Long but effective
- Approved restriction [proposal](#) (**0.062 mg/m<sup>3</sup> for wood-based articles**) sent February 2023 to EP and Council
- 3 months to review – if no veto, then de facto adopted
- Final restriction to be published in OJEU and transition periods start (3 years for articles / 4 years for vehicles)
- **Expected May-June 2023 (+ 3 years transition)**

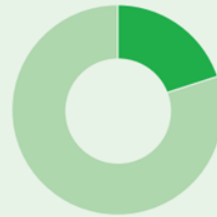
